ONAQUI HERD

The Onaqui herd of wild horses is located in Utah's Western Desert, about 60 miles from Salt Lake City. They roam throughout the Onaqui Herd Management Area (HMA) that encompasses approximately 43,880 acres of federal, state and private land. The HMA extends from Johnsons Pass (near Terra, Utah) south to Lookout Pass, west of Faust, Utah.

These horses have occupied this area since the late 1800's. It is thought that this herd is comprised primarily of horses that escaped from local ranches. There may have been some intermingling of horses from the old Pony Express stock.

When viewing wild horses, please do not chase or harass them in any way. This herd is particularly friendly and at times will walk right up to you for a close look. Wild horses are naturally wary and will spook and run when approached aggressively. All motor vehicles must stay on existing roads in this area, and be sure to leave your dog home if you plan on watching these magnificent animals.
